

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

PCA is excited to provide SUMMER CAMP 2021! Much like the COVID-19 protocols our school put in place during the regular school year, Summer Camp will follow similar protocols to help keep our campers safe. Read on to learn more:



School/Home Partnership:

All families must commit to supporting PCA Summer Camp's health and wellness protocols, including keeping children at home if they have a fever of 100.4 or greater or if they've been exposed to COVID-19. Depending on the type of exposure, campers may need to quarantine for a period of time before being allowed to return to Summer Camp. *Days lost will not be refunded, but if PCA closes a camp class due to COVID, tuition will be credited.*

Screenings:

Campers will be temperature-checked upon arrival. Those with temperatures of 100.4 or greater will be sent home and must remain there until symptom-free for 72 hours. If a camper feels sick during his/her time at camp, parents will be called immediately for pick up.

Facial Coverings:

All campers are required to wear facial coverings while in hallways and common areas, but not while they're engaged in physical activity outdoors. Preschoolers will not be required to wear masks in their classrooms, but children in elementary are required unless they are physically distant.

Camp Activities:

Many activities will take place outside. Research shows that outdoor gatherings are 19 times less likely to spread the virus, and are thus a safer option for summer camps.

Classroom Arrangements:

All campers will remain in small groups, with an effort being made to keep groups consistent throughout the day. Air purifiers have been installed in every classroom to further increase the cleanliness of our environments. We also utilize a Clorox Total 360 Electrostatic Sprayer system that helps reduce pathogens and delivers superior coverage for disinfecting and sanitizing surfaces.

Chapel:

Chapel will take place each week in the auditorium to ensure ample physical distancing. All campers will be required to wear masks.

Guests: Visitors and parents will not be allowed in the building as we continue to help prevent the possible spread of infection.
